Program Overview

The AQ – Teaching Ojibwe Part One course is 125 hours; open to candidates who meet the entry requirements identified in the Teacher’s Qualifications regulation. Successful completion of this course will be recorded on the candidates Certificate of Qualification and Registration.

This course focuses on improving teacher fluency in order to improve the quality of Anishinaabemowin education that they provide in their classrooms. Teachers will improve their fluency, as well as learn new hands on, activity-based approaches to language learning and teaching by participating in the activities themselves. Grammar instruction will also be provided to transmit the finer details of a fluent speaker’s speech, and to provide a greater depth of language understanding and knowledge. This course stresses the greatest way to achieve fluency in Anishinaabemowin is to speak it, use it, act it out, and experience it. So, the course is focused this way, with the objective being that teachers will implement this kind of teaching in their respective language classrooms.
