## Student Lounge

## Cultural Room

## Makerspace

Moreover, our dedicated student engagement and wellness coordinator utilizes the makerspace to host wellness and personal growth workshops. ## **Student Lounge**

This multifunctional space not only serves as a gathering place for students but also plays host to Kenjgewin Teg's Student Nutrition Program. As part of this program, students are provided with a complimentary daily breakfast and lunch, ensuring they have nourishment to fuel their learning journey. Whether you're looking for a comfortable spot to socialize, study, or enjoy a nutritious meal, the student lounge is a welcoming space where you can connect with fellow students and take advantage of the support and resources available.

## **Welding Shop**

Equipped with nine modern welding booths, Kenjgewin Teg's shop provides an exceptional learning environment for aspiring welders. It boasts an extensive range of cutting-edge equipment, including an ironworker, a CNC plasma table, two burning tables, a sheet metal box and pan brake, a manual vertical mill, a manual lathe, a track cutting torch, as well as various fitting and hand tools. The shop is designed to provide hands-on experience and practical training, allowing students to develop their skills and master the art of welding using the latest industry tools and techniques.

## **Lloyd Debassige Memorial Wood Shop**

This multifunctional space houses an array of essential tools, allowing carpentry students to transform rough-cut lumber into beautiful, finished products. Equipped with state-of-the-art equipment, such as the Axoim Iconic 8 CNC router table, Kenjgewin Teg's wood shop provides endless possibilities for precision and creativity. From compound mitre saws to planers, routers to band saws, table saws to spindle sanders, jointers to belt sanders, our shop boasts a comprehensive collection of tools. Additionally, we offer an assortment of clamps, air tools, and cordless power tools to facilitate our student's woodworking projects. Step into the Lloyd Debassige Memorial Wood Shop and unleash your craftsmanship to bring your visions to life.



# Woodlands Outdoor Learning Space

## Kino-Maadwin Wiigwaam (Teaching Lodge)

The Kenjgewin Teg Teaching Lodge is a remarkable structure crafted by our dedicated staff and students. Constructed using traditional materials of birch bark and saplings, this sacred space embodies the essence of Anishinaabe culture and teachings. The Teaching Lodge serves as a focal point for numerous Anishinaabe Aadziwin events and teachings, including Miigwechwendam, held every Wednesday morning. During Miigwechwendam, students and staff gather in a circle around the warm crackling fire, sharing expressions of gratitude and fostering a sense of community and connection.

## Kim Corbiere-ba Memorial Medicine Garden

The garden is a serene sanctuary within Kenjgewin Teg. This beautiful space features a variety of annual plants, shrubs, and, most importantly, the four sacred medicines. As a student of Kenjgewin Teg, you are encouraged to take moments of personal reflection and rejuvenation by visiting this tranquil space. Whether you seek solace, connection with nature, or simply a moment of respite, the Kim Corbiere-ba Memorial Medicine Garden warmly welcomes you to find peace and grounding in its nurturing embrace.

## Ziizbaakda Kaaning (Sugar shack) and Jiibaakwe Gamgoong (Cookhouse)

Both outdoor gathering places play a vital role in the Anishinaabe Aadziwin team's teachings and feasts, providing spaces where students can connect with their heritage and embrace the wisdom passed down through generations. Throughout the year, the cookhouse comes alive with vibrant activities and experiential learning opportunities. In the spring, students embark on an exciting field trip to a local sugar bush, where they learn firsthand about the process of collecting sap from maple trees. Returning to the cookhouse, students engage in the art of transforming that sap into delectable maple syrup.

As an Indigenous or non-Indigenous learner at Kenjgewin Teg, you will be welcomed to join many learning experiences designed to support you in new and enhanced learning within your program of study, based on our Anishinabek worldview.

Anishinaabe Aadziwin is one of Kenjgewin Teg's core philosophies. Once enrolled in your chosen program, you will learn more about why Anishinaabe Aadziwin is an important part of your learning experience at Kenjgewin Teg. Just know at this time that you will be provided opportunities throughout the year for learning in Anishinabek history, Anishinaabemowin (language), harvesting, traditional teachings, ceremonies, song, dance and land-based practices.

Anishinaabe Aadziwin is present in all our programs; you will see that students, instructors, and staff gather in learning to acknowledge Indigenous - Anishinabek identity, a unique worldview, and how this understanding supports not only academic success, but also overall well-being. As an Indigenous or non-Indigenous learner enrolled at Kenjgewin Teg, we believe you will be pleasantly surprised how much you will discover about yourself and others by joining our Anishinabek and Anishinaabe-Aadziwin place of learning!

## GRADUATING WITH ANISHINAABE AADZIWIN DISTINCTION

Once enrolled at Kenjgewin Teg, you will track and document your participation in various Anishinaabe Aadziwin activities and experiences in your Aadziwin passport to learning. Once you have reached the minimum number of hours of learning in your passport for your program, you will be recognized with your peers during graduation celebrations as a recognized Graduate with Distinction in Anishinaabe Aadziwin!

## Student Wellness

We strive to support the whole health of our learners. This means that alongside your academics, we also care about the other factors that make up your overall good health. Our goal is for our learners to feel grounded in a sense of self, culture, and well-being overall.

Our team will get to know you as a person and develop a variety of activities based on you and your peers as well. Student Wellness, E'kinoomaagazid Nnaawziyaaying, encompasses learning on topics related to life skills such as goal setting, prioritizing, discipline vs. motivation, time tactics, taking mindful breaks, antidotes to anxiety & stress, study and focus hacks, taking care of self-balance, emotional regulation, and mood stabilization. We also like to plan weekly gatherings relating to Anishinabek cultural traditions, meditation and mindfulness, informal and fun Anishinaabemowin language learning, craft making, and art. Monthly, we often come together for larger-scale engagement opportunities, often outdoors or in our Teaching Lodge, and centred around experiential learning.

Your student voice is important to us! We encourage our learners to let us know what can make Kenjgewin Teg feel a little more like a family away from home.

## STUDENT SUCCESS SPOTLIGHT

"No matter how old you are, it's never too late to go back to school," shared Kenjgewin Teg Alumni Elaine Trudeau. "I wouldn't be where I am today if it weren't for the amazing staff at Kenjgewin Teg."

Elaine Trudeau started her learning journey with Kenjgewin Teg in 2014 in the Pathways to Post-Secondary and Employment department, graduating in 2015 with her GED.

She attended Cambrian College, completing the Social Services Worker program and graduating with Deans Honours. From 2017 to 2020, Elaine attended Laurentian University, graduating with Cum Laude Honours.

In 2020, Elaine returned to Kenjgewin Teg for the Master of Social Work-Indigenous Field of Study (MSW-IFS) program, offered in partnership with Wilfrid Laurier University.

"Attending the MSW-IFS at Kenjgewin Teg was a journey in itself," said Elaine, who shared that her journey was beyond the practical knowledge she has gained from the program. "I've learned so much about myself. I discovered a part of who I am as an Indigenous kwe, a part of my own identity, my purpose, and the path I'm taking moving forward."

Elaine graduated from the MSW-IFS program in 2022. Her next goal is to complete her Ph.D.

"I am so amazed at how far I've come and excited to see where I will be going on from here," Elaine concluded. "Chi Miigwetch Miinwaa (thanks again) Kenjgewin Teg."

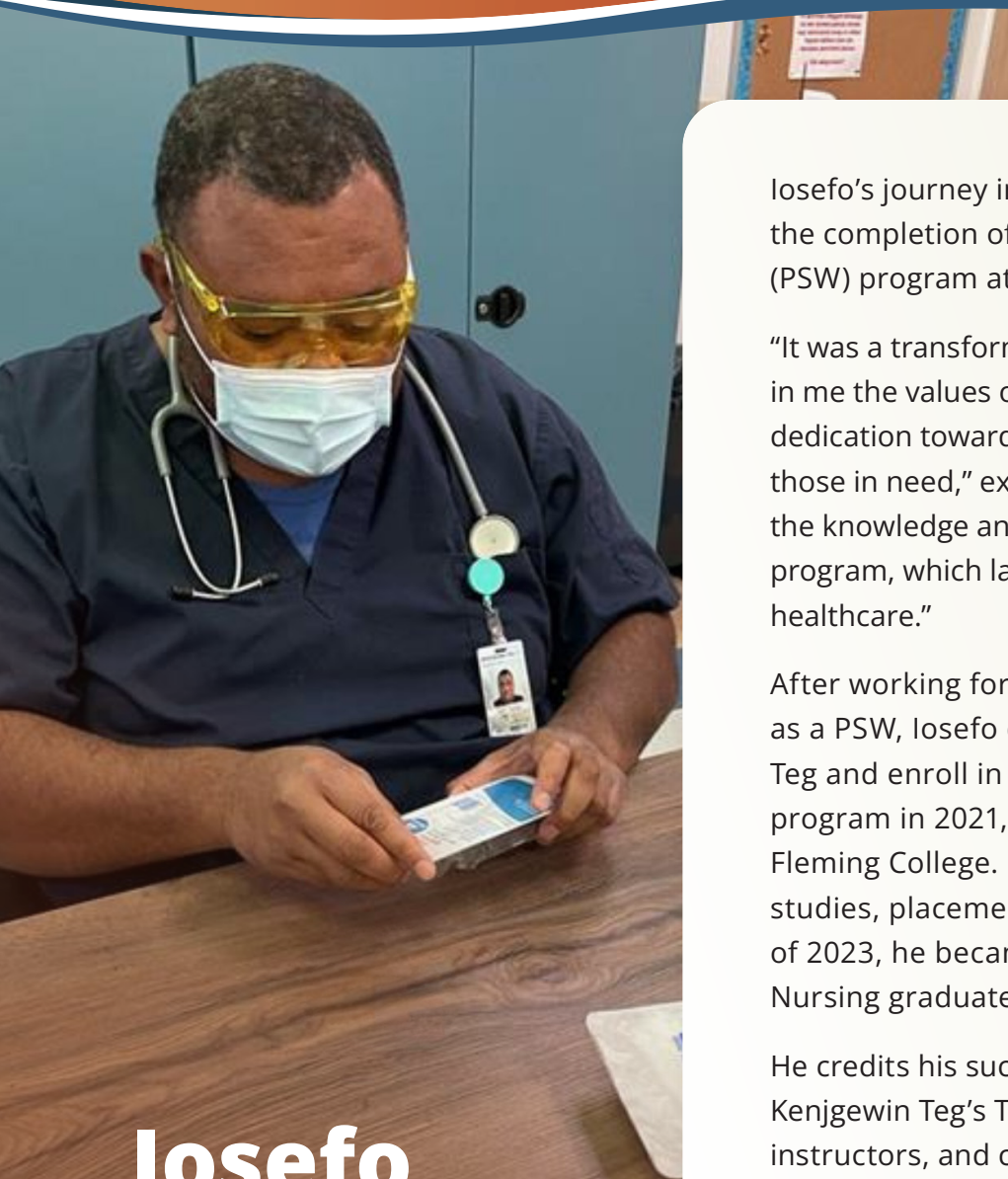

Iosefo's journey in healthcare began in 2013 with the completion of the Personal Support Worker (PSW) program at Kenjgewin Teg.

"It was a transformative experience that instilled in me the values of compassion, empathy, and dedication towards providing quality care to those in need," explained Iosefo. "I am grateful for the knowledge and skills that I gained from the program, which laid the foundation for my future in healthcare."

After working for several years in the community as a PSW, Iosefo decided to return to Kenjgewin Teg and enroll in the Practical Nursing (PN) program in 2021, offered in partnership with Fleming College. Iosefo worked hard balancing his studies, placement, and family, and in the spring of 2023, he became Kenjgewin Teg's first Practical Nursing graduate.

He credits his success in the PN program to Kenjgewin Teg's Traditional Knowledge Holders, instructors, and community Elders.

"Their guidance, encouragement, and support have been instrumental in my journey, and I am forever grateful for their presence in my life", he shared. "They taught me the importance of holistic care and the value of cultural humility in healthcare."

Iosefo is currently employed as a PN at the Mindemoya site of the Manitoulin Health Centre and resides in M'Chigeeng First Nation with his partner and three children.

# Canadian Welding Bureau Certification

**PROGRAM LENGTH:** 14 weeks

**CREDENTIAL:** CWB Certification(s) – *Upon successful completion of testing*





Kenjgewin Teg stands as an accredited testing center with the Canadian Welding Bureau (CWB) Group, allowing students to learn and become certified in welding procedures without leaving their home communities.

Immersed in Kenjgewin Teg's CWB program, students begin on an interactive educational journey, honing practical skills that align precisely with the demands of welding assessments administered on-site by a dedicated CWB inspector.

The program's seasoned instructor equips learners with the indispensable tools required to confidently enter the welding workforce, setting the stage for a prosperous career in this dynamic, in demand field.

The curriculum introduces, refines, and applies foundational welding procedures and principles. Techniques are developed for fillet and groove welds; proficiency in flat and horizontal positions is also developed. Vertical/Overhead positions are taught, depending upon student capabilities. Upon completion of the course, students test for CWB Certification in SMAW and GMAW Flat and Horizontal.

This program prepares you for a career as a CWB Certified Welder in fabrication shops, mines, building construction, and potential apprenticeships with Trade Unions.

Aaron credits his mother with his decision to attend Kenjgewin Teg. "She pushed me to pursue my post-secondary studies when I thought it wasn't for me."

He enjoyed the small class size in Kenjgewin Teg's Renovation Techniques - Construction Carpentry program and appreciated the one-on-one support from instructors. He also noted the size of the shop classroom and variety of tools.

Aaron said he and his fellow classmates became a construction crew, working collaboratively on projects.

"My favourite class was framing because we started working together like a construction crew, except we built sheds, not houses," said Aaron. "We all had the jobs we were good at, just like any crew."

Aaron graduated from Kenjgewin Teg's Renovation Techniques - Construction Carpentry program in the spring of 2023 and applied to the Carpenters Union.

# Indigenous Teacher Education Program

**PROGRAM LENGTH:** Two Years – Full-time Status

**CREDENTIAL:** Bachelor of Education

The Indigenous Teacher Education Program (ITEP) is a community-based program offered in partnership between Kenjgewin Teg and Queen's University. Graduates of this program will receive a Bachelor of Education degree with a focus in the Primary-Junior divisions (K-6). This teacher education program will provide candidates with an opportunity to specialize in Indigenous education, with many courses being taught by Indigenous professors.

ITEP fosters excellence and pride in Indigenous Education by empowering candidates to excel in their individual growth as teachers, learners, partners, and role models. Candidates will be placed on 18 weeks of experiential-based practicum throughout their two years in the program in First Nations and/or Provincial school(s).

Graduates will be prepared to teach in First Nations and provincial schools at the Primary/Junior level and will have the skills and knowledge to be effective in meeting the current and future educational needs of their communities.

# Danette McGregor

## KENJGEWIN TEG ALUMNI, INDIGENOUS TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM

Danette is the former manager of the childcare centre in her home community of Whitefish River First Nation, and it is there that she first learned of Kenjgewin Teg's Indigenous Teacher Education Program (ITEP), in partnership with Queen's University.

"I felt that taking the program would be a natural progression in my career," said Danette. "The Indigenous Teacher Education Program allowed me to continue in my current role as an Ekinoomaagekwe - Ojibwe Language Teacher (at Shawanosowe School in Whitefish River First Nation) and expand my knowledge."

Danette said she was impressed with her ITEP professors and felt they met all four aspects of student learning needs—spiritual, mental, emotional and physical growth.

"Our (Anishinabek) sacred laws, ninda niizhwaaswi kinomaadwinan (Seven Grandfather Teachings), were embedded throughout the program," Danette explained. "I appreciated the respect shown to our culture and teachings."

"As ITEP teacher candidates, we were taught about lifelong learning," added Danette.

"The program promoted the idea that education is bigger than the classroom and created a foundation for teaching all aspects of Mino Bimaadziwin ~ The Good Way of Life guided by the gifts from the Seven Grandfathers and the four quadrants of the Medicine Wheel."

Danette graduated from the ITEP program in the spring of 2023.

# Master of Education in World Indigenous Studies

IN PARTNERSHIP WITH QUEEN'S UNIVERSITY

**PROGRAM LENGTH:** 36 – 48 months, Part-Time

**CREDENTIAL:** Master of Education, M.Ed

Master of Education in World Indigenous Studies in Education (WISE) is a progressive MEd program that allows you to pursue your research interests without leaving your community, family or job. The program is offered part-time blended (online and on-campus) for students with experience in Indigenous communities or World Indigenous issues. We welcome allyship and students with experience and/or demonstrated commitment to Indigenous truth, reconciliation, and knowledge mobilization.

Course topics include Indigenous Languages Revitalization, Educational Research in Indigenous Contexts, Orality in Indigenous Thought, Government Policies within an Indigenous Context, and Indigenous Feminism.

The first summer of the program is on-campus at Queen's University, and the remaining courses are online. Students beginning their program in July will be on campus for their first term. Students starting their program in September will be on campus in July of their first year.

# Decolonizing Education Certificate

**CREDENTIAL:** Certificate of Participation (module completion) or Professional Development and Training Certificate (minimum six of eight modules completed)

The Decolonizing Education Certificate is designed for individuals who want to develop their capacity to understand Indigenous perspectives in the history of colonization to contemporary realities in Canada and are interested in responding to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC) calls for action in a meaningful way.

This certificate covers an array of topics from pre-contact to colonial contact. The topics will help people understand and appreciate Indigenous perspectives in decolonizing education (first four modules) and understand one's position in solidarity with Indigenous peoples (last four modules).

**Module 1 - Introduction to Indigenous Perspectives and Knowledge: Cultural History and Colonial History**

**Module 2 - Introduction to Indigenous Perspectives and Knowledge: Policy, Land & Governance**

# Teaching First Nations Metis and Inuit (FNMI) Children

**COURSE LENGTH:** Schedule C, 125 hours

**CREDENTIAL:** Additional Qualification (AQ), Schedule C

FNMI stories center each major theme as the roots and starting points of this course. Teacher candidates will reflect individually and collaboratively, with the encouragement to draw on their experiences to scaffold the learning. Place and land will also center the learning just as Anishinaabe cultures, languages, customs, and ways of life are a product of their environment.

The main topics include origin stories and legends, a revisionist colonial North American history from the perspective

of FNMI nations, decolonization versus reconciliation, the teacher's role in today's era of reconciliation, and pathways moving forward. Reflection, investigation, collaboration, experience, and student-directed learning inform the learning.

Teaching Ojibwe (Anishinaabemowin), Part 1 provides relevant, meaningful, and practical experience in reading, writing, speaking, reflection, dialogue, and expression in Anishinaabemowin.

Candidates will explore strategies aimed at increasing participants' Anishinaabemowin fluency, which will ultimately enhance instruction at the school level. Some of the techniques explored will be participating in simulations, workshops, and interpersonal learning.

The candidate's prior knowledge and experiences positively affect the course environment for mentorship, team learning, collaborative inquiry, and independent study.



# Living with the Land: Indigenous Knowledge in Theory and Practice

# Funding Support for Learners

## For First Nation Learners – As Eligible

### Post-Secondary Student Support Program (PSSSP)

If you are an eligible Status Indian or Inuit student, you may be eligible for financial support in your post-secondary studies on a part-time or full-time basis. Kenjgewin Teg will support you in liaising with your First Nation community if needed; policies and eligibility criteria for financial support and sponsorship for learners are made by the First Nation community.

### ASETS and Local Delivery Mechanism (LDM)

In Kenjgewin Teg's local region, the Anishinabek Nation holds a Labour Market Development Agreement with Canada since 1996 known as the ASETS Agreement. This Agreement allows participating First Nation Employment and Training programs and services provided by Local Delivery Mechanism (LDM) offices to assist First Nation citizens in gaining the skills and training required to enter the labour market and succeed. Of particular interest to eligible post-secondary learners, LDM services may include and support the purchase of training (i.e., tuition and other eligible financial supports) for learners.

For the Anishinabek Nation member communities in Ontario, there are 9 Local Delivery Mechanisms supporting learners:

# Kenjgewin Teg Secondary School

**CREDENTIAL:** Ontario Secondary School Diploma

Admission to the school is continuous, and academics are offered year round, allowing for intake at anytime!

## The PLAR Assessment

Are you a Mature Student interested in obtaining your Ontario Grade 12 Diploma (OSSD)? You may be closer to that goal than you think.

Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) process is the formal evaluation and credit-granting process whereby students may obtain credits for prior learning.

### *The Process Has Two Components:*

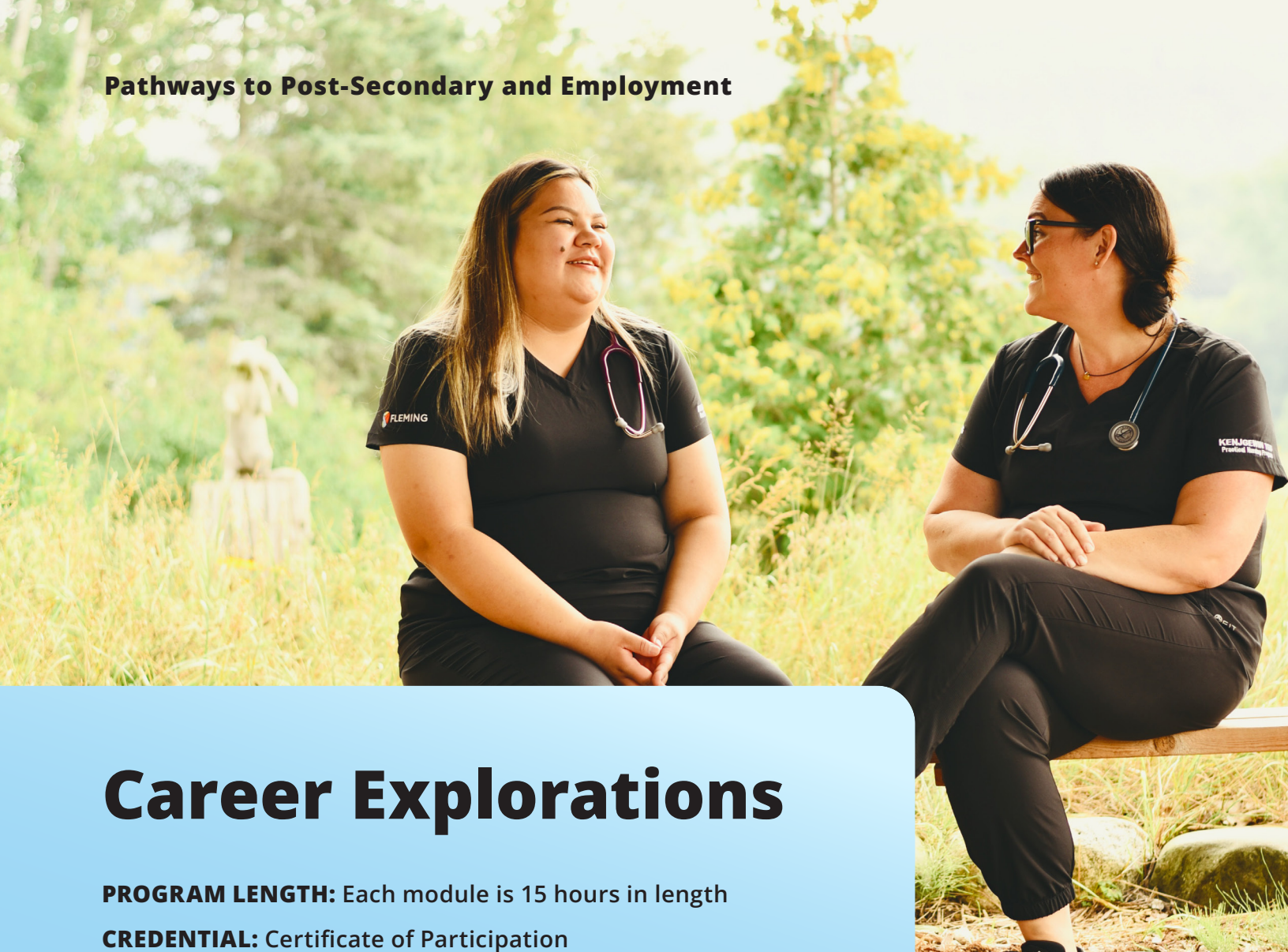
1. The junior component allows up to 16 credits to be granted based on the outcome of a series of evaluations based on grade 9 and 10 compulsory courses.
2. The second phase honours the learning that a mature student has obtained outside the classroom for work and life experience. Up to 10 credits can be awarded through the process of documenting this learning and evaluating it against learning outcomes in secondary school courses.

### *In all cases, students wishing to obtain PLAR credits/equivalency must:*

1. Be 18 years of age and out of school for a period of one year
2. Have fewer than 26 credits

### *How Long Does it Take?*

Unfortunately, it is impossible to answer that question as there are too many variables. However, graduation in less than a year is possible for a student able to maximize the benefits of the PLAR process.

# Portfolio Development

**PROGRAM LENGTH:** Each module is 15 hours in length

**CREDENTIAL:** Certificate of Participation

Portfolio Development guides learners through the process of developing their own professional portfolio. Students move through a sequential process from concept to presentation, including self-exploration, researching and writing an Autobiographical Sketch, planning for and interviewing community members (including former teachers and employers), primary and secondary research on careers, resume writing, and assembling and presenting their final professional portfolio. Video interviews with community guests provide interpersonal connections with people who have travelled this journey and share their experiences.

# Academic Upgrading

## **Kenjgewin Teg offers Academic upgrading opportunities in 3 ways:**

1. Kenjgewin Teg Secondary School can support learners in obtaining program prerequisite courses such as in English, Math and Science disciplines.
2. Our pathways team can also deliver select Post-Secondary courses that offer an alternative pathway to Post-Secondary Programs.
3. As a member of Ontario Learn, students can access Online Post-Secondary Courses. These courses could be used to meet admission requirements for a program, reduce the course load of a particular semester, recover a course where a student was unsuccessful or provide a flexible alternative to meet an individual's schedule.

## OntarioLearn

OntarioLearn includes 25 post-secondary institutions with almost 1,500 shared online courses and over 650 online programs.

Students may search for a specific course in OntarioLearn's online inventory and choose to enroll with an institution that offers their desired course.

Kenjgewin Teg selects courses from host colleges to locally promote and advertising them to future students and learners through social media and the newspaper. Students register for these courses with Kenjgewin Teg's OntarioLearn coordinator.

Upon registration, students are provided with login information for the OntarioLearn Student Portal, where they may access their courses. Any courses offered by Kenjgewin Teg through OntarioLearn are facilitated in the d2L Brightspace Learning Management System. Courses are asynchronous, giving students the flexibility to study in their own space and according to their own schedule. Students may access help desk support 24 hours per day, 365 days per year.
