

SUMMER AQ COURSE

TEACHING OJIBWE PART 1

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: Kenjgewin Teg is an approved provider of Additional Qualifications (AQ) courses, which are professional learning opportunities for educators registered with the Ontario College of Teachers (OCT).

CREDENTIAL: Additional Qualification (AQ) Teaching Ojibwe (Anishinabemowin), Part 1, Schedule C

DATE: July 8 - July 26, 2024

LOCATION: Offered online with a combination of synchronous and asynchronous learning.

COURSE LENGTH: Three weeks (125 Hours)

LOCATION: Online remote delivery with synchronous and asynchronous learning.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Teaching Ojibwe (Anishinabemowin) AQ provides relevant, meaningful, and practical experience in reading, writing, speaking, reflection, dialogue, and expression in Anishinabemowin. Candidates will explore strategies aimed at increasing participants' Anishinabemowin fluency which will ultimately enhance instruction at the school level. Some of the techniques explored will be participating in simulations, workshops, and interpersonal learning. The candidate's prior knowledge and experiences positively affect the course environment for mentorship, team learning, collaborative inquiry, and independent study.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Teachers certified with the OCT are eligible to take AQ courses. Ontario B.Ed students may take courses prior to membership with OCT if they have met all the requirements to graduate and if they have applied to the OCT for a Certificate of Qualification.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: June 28, 2024

COURSE FEE: \$ 675.00

Payment Options: Credit Card (Visa, Mastercard), e-Transfer, purchase order, or certified cheque.

OTHER INFORMATION:

- Candidates' successful completion of the course is largely dependent on their day-to-day class participation.
- Non-certified teachers can apply and will be considered for registration, pending individual circumstances.
