- Explore energy-based teachings for a changing world.
- Gain an understanding of the validity of spirituality, through exploring the physical reality and scientific knowledge behind spirituality and spiritual practices.
- Explore how Colonization changed spiritual beliefs and practices worldwide and why we need to restore them.
