PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Participants will consider Indigenous & Black perspectives and knowledge in relation to land, water, sky, and universe far beyond the narrow framings of life, death, and freedom enforced by settler colonialism, white supremacy, and anti-Black racism.

- Learn about our colonial and other privileges.
- Examine personal and political blockages to decolonization.
- Examine ways for us to be allies / working in solidarity with Indigenous people.
- Have an experiential learning experience.

Participants will leave with the following:

- An understanding of one's position in solidarity with Indigenous peoples.
- A transformative learning experience about decolonization.
- More knowledge, tools, and resources to utilize.
- A network of people with common learning goals.
- Wanting to learn more.
